# LOCATION

**Fair Day activities** take place at the <u>Silvana Community Fairgrounds</u> in downtown Silvana at 1331 Pioneer Hwy (Viking Hall and the fields behind it).

# LIVESTOCK SHADE PROVISIONS

In previous years, the fair has provided large tents for each livestock division. For 2023, there will be **NO FAIR TENTS.** Exhibitors are welcome to bring their own pop-up tents, lawn chairs and portable tables for use near their division areas. Personal pop-up tents may also be used to provide shade for animals. The use of personal generators for cooling or any other purpose is not allowed.

# FOOD AND BEVERAGES

- Food trucks and vendors will be onsite throughout the fair day providing food and beverages for purchase.
- As always, participants and attendees are welcome to bring their own food and beverages (remembering that alcoholic beverages are not allowed)

# WHO CAN ENTER

<u>ANYONE!</u> For 2023, cash premiums and ribbons will be awarded to exhibitors who are 6 through 19 years of age who have not yet graduated from high school or have graduated this year. (Any youth, 4-H, or FFA member who has finished High School prior to the current year will not be eligible.) The 2023 fair welcomes Open-Class exhibitors in the Dog division. There will be NO adult Open-Class animal exhibitors in divisions other than the Dog division. Tiny Tot (5 yrs. & under) and Adult entrants are eligible for ribbon awards only. Special needs individuals who enter livestock or indoor exhibits, including posters and demonstrations, will also be eligible for cash premiums and ribbons. Livestock exhibitors will also receive a T-Shirt.

# LANDSCAPE DISPLAY CONTEST

Failure to clean up bark and other display materials after the fair could result in loss of premium award. Silvana Community Fair will provide beauty bark and rails. # WHEELBARROW UP-CYCLING DISPLAY CONTEST

Re-use, Re-purpose, transform a wheelbarrow into something new, creative, useful, and/or beautiful. All creations must come from 80% recycled products (note: compost is 100% recycled). All entries will be displayed outdoors! Entries will be judged on creativity and over all appearance. The winning display will be announced at 12:00 pm on Saturday. First prize is \$100.00.

Exhibitors shall be solely responsible for themselves and their property at the fair. Neither the Silvana Community Fair Board, nor its representatives, or volunteers, agents, or property, shall be responsible to the exhibitor for loss by fire, theft, damage, delay, mechanical failure, or any cause whatsoever, while the exhibitor and the exhibitor's property, is in transit, at the fair, or while being moved into or out of the fair. Our Fair provides no restitution for loss or damage.

# EXHIBITOR AREA ADVERTISING PROHIBITED

Club signs are welcome. Other advertising, such as for your farm or business, is not allowed.

# **EXHIBIT JUDGING**

All entries are judged according to the Silvana Community Fair Rules and Regulations.

- Superintendents are not eligible to judge in their own departments.
- All projects in all divisions in our fair book are open to 4-H, FFA, and Youth.
- Project Superintendents, under the direction of Fair management and staff, shall have charge of the department to which he/she may be assigned.
- We encourage Originality and Quality!
- Our Fair Management reserves the right to accept late entries if such action would not cause injury to other exhibitors. No entries will be accepted on the day of the fair.
- Our Fair Management reserves the right to remove any exhibit falsely entered or deemed unsuitable or objectionable.
- Our current Fair Year is July 31, 2022 to July 28, 2023 (Inside Exhibits July 31, 2022 to July 24, 2023).

# EXHIBIT RELEASE

No Inside Exhibit shall be released before 5:00 pm on Saturday. All livestock MUST remain on display in their department area until 5:00 PM. No Livestock Exhibit shall be released prior to completion of outside teardown/cleanup which BEGINS at 5:00 pm on Saturday. Violations of the Exhibit Release rules may cause your premium to be forfeited.

# PREMIUM CHECKS

Premium checks will be mailed.

- 1. For livestock entries, envelopes will be available the day of the fair for you to address to yourself.
- 2. For all other entries, envelopes will be available for you to address to yourself when you come to enter your exhibit, poster, or demonstration.

# LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

**Setup/Take-down:** This is a Community Fair. We need YOUR help in setting up AND taking down! These rules are MANDATORY for SHOW!

- 1. Parents / Exhibitors / Leaders <u>MUST</u> help with set-up OR take-down for you to Show & Receive Premium! Children too young to help should have a parent or adult to help in their place for set-up & take-down.
- 2. When you arrive, sign in with the superintendent of your department and then go to your area and help out. You sign for yourself ONLY! You do NOT sign for your club. If helping a young child, then sign for his/her name and also sign up in the adult list as well.
- 3. If possible, bring gloves and tools (T-Post drivers and pullers, hammer, saw, pliers, shovels, 9/16 wrenches/sockets, etc.)
- 4. After work party is over, SIGN OUT.
- 5. <u>If your project area is completed or has enough help, the Superintendent will direct you to another area.</u> If unable to help on the specified night, come another night and help in another area.
- 6. IF YOU CAN'T MAKE THE SET-UP: then you MUST contact the Superintendent by FRIDAY, July 29<sup>th</sup>, and sign up for the TAKE-DOWN on Saturday night, July 29, 2023. <u>IF</u> you are unable to contact your Superintendent, call Mary Fuentes 360-618-2076.
- 7. <u>LEADERS / SUPERINTENDENTS</u> SUNDAY, JULY 30, 9:00 AM CLEAN-UP Minimum of 2 adults from each project to help with clean-up at Viking Hall and Silvana Fairgrounds.
- 8. See <u>FAIRWEEK SCHEDULE</u> above for setup times for each division.

EXHIBITORS MAY SHOW ANIMALS FROM <u>ONE LIVESTOCK DIVISION ONLY.</u> (DIVISIONS # 1 – 12) See Individual Animal Division page for limits of entries. NO SHARING OF ANIMALS. NO MORE THAN <u>ONE EXHIBITOR</u> PER ANIMAL. NO MORE THAN TWO ANIMALS/EXHIBITOR (Except in the Dog Division)

### LIVESTOCK HEALTH PRECAUTIONS

The Silvana Community Fair takes precautions to help prevent the possible spread of disease. Animal exhibitors are allowed to show in only ONE LIVESTOCK DIVISION (Divisions # 1-12). We also ask that exhibitors be vigilant with their biosecurity measures. We suggest that you haul different species of animals separately, disinfecting trailers between loads if hauling another species. If spectators want to pet your animal, politely direct them to the petting zoo. If you have questions, please contact your superintendent or a fair board member.

- 1. Livestock Exhibits
  - a) Must be owned / leased and under the supervision of the exhibitor.
  - b) Must arrive in show condition ONLY SPOT WASHING ALLOWED. Animals MUST be clipped and ready for show.
  - c) Must go through Vet check <u>BY 8:30 AM</u> with proper <u>PAPERS AND VACCINATIONS</u> (if required for your department), AND be free of all warts, ringworm, lice, fleas, foot warts, foot rot, and signs of illness.
  - d) Must be properly secured or penned.
  - e) There is no livestock entry fee.
- 2. Exhibitor MUST enter both Fit & Show and Type exhibit (or other events for Divisions 7 and 12) to receive premiums for those points!
- 3. Judging rings will NOT be held up. Be on deck on time.
- 4. No substitute exhibitors allowed; Exception would be Exhibitor with more than one animal per type class.
- 5. Proper attire is a MUST for both Fitting & Showing and Type! Follow county guidelines.
- 6. NO HORNED ANIMALS! (except fiber goats and horned sheep breeds).
- 7. HERDSMANSHIP: You MUST participate to receive premiums. Bring wheelbarrows, pitch forks, etc. to clean up your area during and after the fair. Before you leave the grounds, have the Superintendent check your area and mark off your Herdsmanship or NO premium will be paid.
